Observing Safe Distancing

June 28th 2020 Fourth Sunday of Pentecost

Please Read All Our Safety Practices

In order to keep everyone safe we ask that you observe the following guidelines based on Federal & State Protocols for Church Worship Services.

- **Masks** are strongly encouraged for those on the lawn. Extra masks are available in the box on the Turquoise Table near the front door. Those that cannot wear masks, should sit on the outer north and east sides of the seating area, or in their cars.
- **Safe Distancing**: We will observe safe distancing: no physical contact, handshakes, or hugs. (We will be developing safe ways for greeting each other).
- **Bathrooms** are located in the Hein 1 Building (visible from the front lawn) and the bathrooms accessible from the back Parking Lot (doors are propped open).
- Those using the Drive-In Option: (front parking lot). Tune your radio to FM 107.9.
- The service will be shortened to 45 minutes, and children will remain with their families throughout the service. The service will include a Children’s time and a Children’s Craft and Activities packet (there will not be Sunday School or nursery care.)
- There will be a single use bulletin/song-sheet for the service, with nothing passed from person to person (offering plate, microphone, etc.).
- Tithes and Offerings Receptacles are located near the front door for those sitting on the lawn, and near the entrance of the front parking lot (for Drive-In Option).
- Persons are encouraged to bring chairs or a blanket to sit on; however, there are chairs available (sanitized each week). There is to be 10 feet of separation between each household group on the lawn. For those in cars: six feet of separation between cars.

Exodus 12:14 And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance forever [*olam*]




Three Biblical Words for Time

		Aion 400 BCE


Twins Scott Kelly and Mark Kelly
