her only friend. It was the only place where she could pour out her heart.

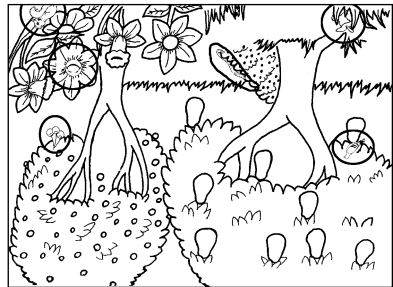

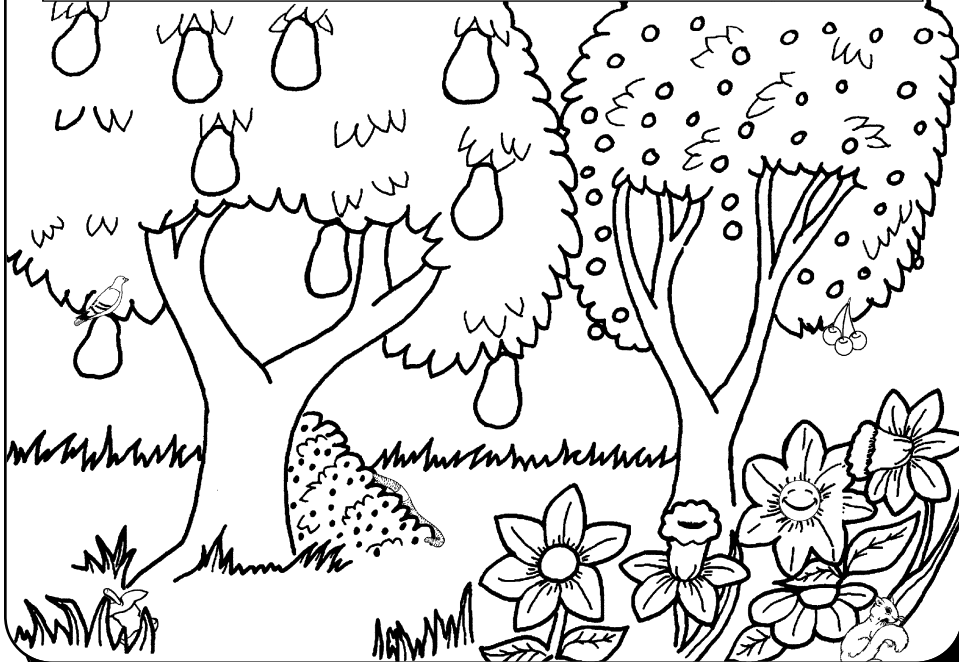
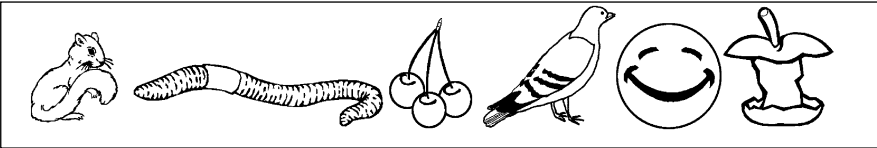
